In order to focus on the study and dialogue between the global and the local realities, students will be able to take advantage of existing courses in areas such as Global Mediated Cultures, Gender and Multicultural Issues in the Global World, Migration and Diasporas, and American Studies in the Global Age, as well as cognates related to global themes.

1. A minimum 2.0 cumulative GPA is required for admission to the program.
2. No courses may be taken as pass/fail.
3. A maximum of one transfer course (three credit hours) may count toward the Certificate by petition.
4. 4 credits of study abroad, internship or co-op and 4 credits of a foreign language above the 302 level may be used with approval of the program director by petition.
5. A minimum 3.0 GPA in the courses counting toward the Certificate and a minimum 2.0 cumulative GPA are required at the time of graduation and/or posting of the certificate.
